Thank you for helping to make AnimeLand Festa 2019 such a smashing success! This year's festival ended on a high note with the announcement that it had seen a record number of visitors (146,232). That wasn't the only milestone, as we witnessed by far the largest number ever of trade stands (47 companies, 126 stands) in addition to the largest ever family area (83 stands).

Tech devices make learning more accessible. A single laptop or tablet can easily hold all the materials a student needs. With just the push of a button or a tap on a screen, students can activate engaging learning experiences, or they can record lectures. However, even in colleges where great importance is placed on technology skills, you will find teachers who insist that students take notes by hand. Why is this? Are those teachers just too old-fashioned?

The truth is that writing (or drawing) by hand has serious benefits that technology has not yet been able to reproduce. Learning how to pick up, grasp and write with a pencil or a pen requires eye-hand coordination and small motor skills. You use eye-hand coordination and small motor skills to access digital technology by clicking a mouse or tapping and swiping touch screens. When you regularly write by hand, you are practicing the skills you need to use technology.

Students who take notes on a computer capture more of what is said in a lecture, but they are less likely to remember what was said. On the other hand, students who create their notes by hand are more likely to remember what they were taught because they had to record or summarize the information.

Composing an essay is quick work on a digital device. Writing by hand slows down the thought process, and it gives the learner time to formulate language expression. Making notes and writing essays by hand requires learners to think about words and how they are spelled, the best ways to use the words in sentences, and how to structure the sentences containing them.

Technology is not going away. Neither should writing by hand because of how it helps students develop their visual motor skills, improve their thinking, and increase their ability to process language. Writing by hand in this digital age is a critical part of 21st-century technology readiness.

Everybody (even lazy people) would like to be a better performer when studying or working. This leads many people to the question, “Is it better to single-task or multi-task?” Single-tasking means focusing on one task from beginning to end, only moving on to another task after the first is complete. Multi-tasking is somewhat of a misleading term: when people use the word, they usually do not actually mean doing two or more tasks at the same time. More often it refers to frequently switching back and forth between several tasks before any of them is finished. It could probably be better described as “switch-tasking.”

There is a gender stereotype that women are better at multi-tasking than men. There is little scientific evidence, however, that the stereotype is correct. The most likely reason that it exists is that women traditionally did much more childrearing and housework. Such tasks demanded that they switch their attention frequently, whether they wanted to or not. What research does show is that, whether done by men or women, multi-tasking is less effective. When people multi-task, reaction time is slower and accuracy is worse. It is also more stressful.

Despite its disadvantages, multi-tasking retains its appeal to many people. One reason for this may be that it enables people to cross things off their “to-do” lists faster. It also satisfies the need to feel busy. It also probably looks good to your boss or teacher.

So, should everyone who is multi-tasking stop it? Well, yes and no. For very familiar tasks (for example, folding your clothes), you may be better off truly multi-tasking and doing something else at the same time. For anything where some concentration is required and accuracy is important, you should avoid switching tasks until you have finished. There is one exception, however: tasks which require us to make creative breakthroughs. Problem solving is a good example. We may have been working hard on a particular problem for some time, not allowing ourselves to switch to another task. Although we stay focused, we do not come up with a solution. In such cases, you might need to go and do something else. This could be a different task or something which is not a task at all. When you let go for a moment from a point of high tension, you may well find that it enables a creative breakthrough.
