On March 14th, 2023, U.S. company OpenAI released GPT-4 for its chatbot, ChatGPT. GPT-4 was the latest version (following GPT-3.5) of its language model. A language model is what makes it possible for a computer to understand and create human language. Using one, a human can communicate with a computer by typing in language on a keyboard. If you add an app, you can also speak to the computer with your voice. The app will change your voice into written text for the computer to understand. Later, when the computer responds in text, the app will change it into a voice that you can hear. In this way, you can ‘chat’ with the computer.

Many people are already using GPT-4 and older versions to answer questions, summarize longer pieces of writing, translate text to other languages, and create content such as blog posts, stories, and imaginary conversations. GPT-4 is also particularly good at generating computer code, thus being of much help to programmers.

Like GPT-3.5, but even more so, the high-level human-like answers which GPT-4 is able to give can be quite surprising. However, one important difference between GPT-4 and GPT-3.5 is that the newer version can also accept input as a mix of images and words. You could, for example, show the computer a photo and ask it to analyze it in some particular way.

Since the release of GPT-4, many more people have started to worry about the possible dangers of artificial intelligence. There are various concerns: some people worry that AI will create a lot of misinformation in society. Others fear that it will take away many people’s jobs. Still others worry that, using powerful AI, criminals or terrorists might be able to harm many more people than before. A few people even say that AI itself might try to destroy humans.

No one can predict the future, not even GPT-4. We can, instead, look at the past. If we do so, we see that in the past every new technology, from cars to calculators, caused similar fears. Perhaps GPT-4 can tell us why this is always the case....

Adolescence is the period of life between the ages of about 10 and 19. It is the period between childhood and adulthood. During adolescence, children are becoming independent and joining the social world while still being dependent on parents in some ways. Many teenagers begin to challenge the rules put in place by parents. Arguments over everyday issues are common.

The subject of the arguments has changed with the times, as new forms of entertainment are used by young people. In the early 20th century, some adults thought that novels would create bad behavior. A generation later, radio dramas were thought to make young listeners more likely to be sick, lose sleep or be stressed. In midcentury, comic books and television were thought to make teenagers antisocial. Most recently, video games were thought to create violent criminals. (This was later proven to be untrue.)

In the early 2020s, many parents are concerned about the impact on children's mental health of social media and digital technologies such as smartphones. Headlines in the media regularly suggest that screen time causes many negative mental and physical health outcomes. Parents fear that screen use may be bad for mental well-being, increase aggressiveness, or lead their children to become addicted to screen time. Teenagers, on the other hand, view screen use as an opportunity to connect with their friends, assert their independence, and learn about the world.

Parents and teenagers argue over three main areas: the effects of looking at screens, the balance of screen time versus other activities, and the reasons for screen use. Parents see looking at screens as bad for the health - particularly of the eyes. Next, they worry that a lot of screen time leaves too little time for studying, exercise and sleep. Finally, they also worry that young people may view extreme violence, watch pornography or get involved in bullying online.

Parents try to monitor their children and create rules regarding screen use. Deciding on these rules is where most of the arguing takes place. Despite the new technology, this conflict is nothing new at all.
