“AI washing” does not refer to the use of microchips in washing machines. It is true that many modern washing machines have microchips in them. “AI washing,” however, refers to a claim by a company that its product or service uses AI, when it really does not.

Why might a company do this? The first reason is to make their products or services seem more attractive. Many companies have already been using AI for quite some time, but over the past two years AI has quickly become a popular catchword among consumers. The new popularity of AI is driving sales in many areas. AI in refrigerators is over a decade old, but AI shoes and AI dog bowls have only existed since 2023.

The second reason is to make companies, both old and new, seem more attractive to investors. In order for companies to be successful, they not only need to develop attractive products and services but they need people to invest money in them. Young companies in particular must appeal to investors on a regular basis. They often use brochures to explain what products or services they are developing and why these are likely to be successful. Many investors have been looking for opportunities to invest in AI in some way. It is seen as an area where business is likely to grow.

The problem is that if companies tell lies about their products or services, either to customers or to investors, it is illegal and can get your company into big trouble. This is particularly the case with financial or investment services, where the laws are very strict. Saying that a washing machine which contains a microchip uses “AI” may just be a choice of words. In contrast, telling customers that your company uses AI to provide financial advice when it does not can cause your company to be publicly warned by the government and maybe heavily fined. Of course, such a public warning would greatly damage the company’s reputation and would likely lead to it losing many customers.

The streets of Barcelona in Spain are often crowded during the summer. Barcelona is a very popular tourist destination, having received 15.6 million tourists in 2023. For a few days in the summer of 2024, the streets were even more crowded than usual, not with tourists but with protestors. Barcelona was in the international news, as 3,000 people took to the streets to complain about “overtourism.”

Tourism brings in a lot of money, both to businesses and local government, and it employs a lot of people. 14% of all business activity in Barcelona is tourism-related and over 125,000 people are employed in businesses which serve only tourists. Many more people are employed in businesses, such as restaurants or transportation, which many tourists use.

What is it that people are protesting against? The protestors have three major complaints. First, they are upset that the increasing number of holiday rental apartments is making the price of housing too high for local people. Second, they claim that overcrowding in some popular spots is destroying the traditional lifestyle of those areas. Finally, they are upset about the costs which are being placed on public services by the large number of tourists.

Overtourism has also recently become an urgent topic of discussion in Japan. In one way this is surprising, as Japan receives far fewer tourists per citizen than countries such as Spain and France, or even Iceland and Malaysia. The worry about overtourism in Japan may be due to the fast rate of change. There were 6.2 million international visitor arrivals in 2011. In 2019 this had increased to 31.9 million. What is more, the majority of visitors tend to focus on the same few spots that have become the focus of attention on social media.

At the same time, much of the country remains relatively empty. Rural Japan, less-fashionable prefectures and even some neighborhoods of Tokyo are notable for their lack of tourists. Japan seems to be experiencing both overtourism and its opposite at the same time.
